

NOTICE OF RACE Sunday Series 2022/2023



25 September, 6 November, 2022 29 January, 26 February, 26 March 2023

1 RULES

The event is governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing 2021-24 (RRS) and the prescriptions and Special Regulations of Australian Sailing applicable to Category 7 races. From 1 January 2022, any person on board who is not a financial member of an AS recognised yacht club must apply and receive a Sail Pass before racing to comply with RRS 46. AS prescription.

2 ELIGIBILTY

- 2.1 The series is open to all boats of monohull construction on the register of a sailing club affiliated with Australian Sailing.
- 2.2 Pointscores are open to series entries only. Casual entries do not score points but are eligible for the weekly prize presentation.

3 EVENT FORMAT AND SCHEDULE

- 3.1 The series will consist of five (5) Sunday races on 25 September 2022, 6 November 2022, 29 January 2023, 26 February 2023 and 26 March 2023
- 3.2 It is intended that there will be two divisions:
 - (a) Division A
 - (b) Division B
- 3.3 The race committee will allocate boats to Divisions.
- 3.4 The Race Committee may choose to add or delete divisions depending on entry numbers.
- 3.5 Boats shall not fly spinnakers. Headsails may be poled out but must be tacked to the foot of the forestay and fully hanked or attached to the forestay by a luff groove device. The forestay is as defined in the current World Sailing Equipment Rules of Sailing. Couta boats or similar craft are exempted from this provision where the forestay is integrated in the headsail luff.
- 3.6 Handicaps will be determined by the Race Committee based on performance and will be by a Time Correction Factor (TCF) applied to a boat's elapsed time. Handicaps will be reviewed considering all previous races sailed and may be subject to arbitrary adjustment.
- 3.7 Determinations or decisions by the race committee about allocation to divisions or handicaps shall not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1.
- 3.8 Divisions and handicaps will be advised on the list of entries available from the RPEYC website at, www.rpeyc.com.au or the RPEYC office.
- 3.9 Scheduled time of the first warning signal is 1125 hr.

4 ENTRY

- 4.1 Eligible boats may enter for the entire series (5 races) or as a casual entry nominating the date(s) on which the boat intends to race. Entry online by using the RPEYC website Race Entry process into the SailSys system.
- 4.2 All boats entering shall upload a copy of a current completed Category 7 (or higher) Equipment Audit Form and a current third-party insurance certificate (refer to paragraph 16.1 below) to the boat's Compliance page in SailSys, or forward to the RPEYC Sailing Office at sailing@rpeyc.com.au by the relevant entry closing date and time.
- 4.3 Closing dates and times for entries are as follows:
 - (a) Series Entries. 1700hr on 19th September 2022.
 - (b) Casual Entries. 1000hr on the day of the race.
- 4.4 Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Race Committee.

5 ENTRY FEE

- 5.1 Entry fees are as follows:
 - (a) Full Series (5 races) \$150, or
 - (b) Casual entry for one race \$40.

6 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

6.1 Sailing Instructions will be available from the RPEYC website or the RPEYC clubhouse.

7 RACING AREA

7.1 Racing will be conducted on Sydney Harbour. The Starting Line and Finishing Line will be between the RPEYC Clubhouse and Shark Island.

8 COURSES

8.1 Courses will be around Sydney Harbour marks and islands as described in the Sailing Instructions.

9 PENALTY SYSTEM

9.1 Penalties shall be in accordance with RRS 44.1 and 44.2 only. RRS 44.3 shall not apply.

10 SCORING

- 10.1 RRS A5.3 will apply.
- 10.2 There will be no discards in the series.

11 COMMUNICATION

11.1 All boats shall carry an operating marine band VHF radio capable of receiving normal marine international channels. The radio must be always switched on and tuned to the correct race committee frequency.

12 EQUIPMENT

12.1 RRS 52 is changed so that it does not apply for the adjustment and operation of sails or the adjustment of movable appendages on any boat.

13 CHANGES AFFECTING PERFORMANCE

13.1 Any changes to hull, engine, propeller, trim, spars, sails including any modified, new, or replacement sails shall be notified in writing to RPEYC no later than 1000 hours on the day prior to the race affected by the changes. This may result in a change of handicap.

14 RISK WARNING

- 14.1 Participants are warned that, regardless of the precautions, which might be taken by reasonable and experienced persons, sailing can be a dangerous pursuit and participants are exposed to significant risk of property damage, physical harm and possibly death.
- 14.2 As an indication, these risks may include, but are not limited to:
 - (a) The extremes of weather and sea conditions.
 - (b) The potential that control of vessels may be lost, resulting in collision with objects and other vessels.
 - (c) The sudden movement of the vessel at any time and the possibility that participants may fall or be thrown overboard, resulting in drowning or exposure injury.
 - (d) The possibility that participants may be injured by equipment on the vessel.
 - (e) The absence of immediate medical care and the possibility that significant delays may occur before medical care is available.
 - (f) Exposure to the elements for extended periods.
- 14.3 Participants are also advised that although the Organising Authority is covered by third party liability insurance, this cover does not extend to participants. Any participant who considers they have a need for insurance must make their own private arrangements with an insurer.
- 14.4 Owners and persons in charge of boats shall ensure that all participants on their boats are aware of this risk warning.

15 DISCLAIMER

15.1 All those taking part in the event do so at their own risk and responsibility. The Organising Authority and its race officials accept no liability for any damage or injury in connection with the event and Owners release the Organising Authority from any claim or liability whatsoever for any harm or personal injury in connection with the event.

16 INSURANCE

16.1 Each participating boat shall be covered by current Third-Party Property Liability Insurance and Third-Party Personal Liability insurance of not less than \$10,000,000 (ten million) for each incident. All insurance cover shall be maintained during the period of racing.

17 PRIZES

Prizes will be presented to all eligible placegetters in the RPEYC Clubhouse after each race. Prizes not collected within one week will be forfeited.

A trophy will be awarded to the winner of the series pointscore in each division to be presented at the end of the season Prizegiving evening at RPEYC in May 2023.
