Sailing Instructions

66th Annual Wednesday Afternoon Series 2026/2027

7 October 2026 to 21 April 2027

The Organising Authority is the Royal Prince Edward Yacht Club (RPEYC)

1. RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in the World Sailing Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) and the Special Regulations of Australian Sailing (AS) applicable to races of Category 7 and above, as amended.
- 1.2 Any person on board who is not a financial member of an AS recognised sailing club must apply for and receive a SailPass before racing to comply with RRS 46, AS prescription.

2. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any changes to the sailing instructions will be posted before 1000 hours on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 1800 hours on the day before it will take effect.

3. COMMUNICATION WITH COMPETITORS

- 3.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official noticeboards located at RPEYC and the Royal Sydney Yacht Squadron (RSYS). Notices may also be made available to competitors on each club's website.
- 3.2 The list of entries will be placed on the RPEYC website no later than two hours before the start of each race.

- 3.4 All boats shall carry an operating marine band VHF radio capable of receiving the normal marine international channels. The radio shall be switched on at all times while racing and tuned to the Race Committee channel.
- 3.5 The Race Committee intends to monitor and communicate with competitors on VHF radio channel 73.
- 3.6 While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

4. SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 4.1 Racing will be conducted on every Wednesday from 7 October 2026 to 21 April 2027, excluding 23 December 2026 and 30 December 2026, for a total of 27 races.
- 4.2 Race 7, on Wednesday 18 November 2026, will be the RPEYC Centenary Regatta. That race will include spinnaker divisions and may include a 'Classics' Division, for that race only. Separate sailing instructions for the spinnaker divisions in the Centenary Regatta will be issued by 11 November 2026.
- 4.3 Races abandoned will not be re-sailed.

5. DIVISIONS AND HANDICAPS

- 5.1 It is intended that there will be five divisions: Division 1, Division 2, Division 3, Division 4 and Division 5. The Race Committee will allocate boats to divisions and may add or delete divisions depending on entry numbers.
- 5.2 Divisions and handicaps will be advised on the list of entries available from the RPEYC website.
- 5.3 Performance Handicap (PHS) is the default handicapping system applied to all boats entered. PHS handicaps are determined by the Race Committee and are applied as a Time Correction Factor (TCF) to a boat's elapsed time. Handicaps will be reviewed having regard to all previous races sailed and may be subject to adjustment.
- 5.4 Results will also be calculated under the International Rating Certificate (IRC) for weekly prizes only; there is no IRC series pointscore. A boat electing to compete under IRC shall hold a valid IRC Standard (or endorsed) certificate for the current year. The IRC Rules Parts A, B and C current at the time of each race shall apply, and IRC Rule 22.4 shall not apply.
- 5.5 Determinations or decisions by the Race Committee about allocation to divisions or handicaps shall not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1.

6. SAILS AND EQUIPMENT

- 6.1 Except in Race 7 (the Centenary Regatta), boats shall not fly spinnakers. Headsails may be poled out but shall be tacked to the foot of the forestay and fully hanked or attached to the forestay by a luff groove device. The forestay is as defined in the current World Sailing Equipment Rules of Sailing. Cutout boats and similar craft are exempted from this provision where the forestay is integrated in the headsail luff.
- 6.2 RRS 52 is changed so that it does not apply to the adjustment and operation of sails or the adjustment of movable appendages on any boat.

7. STARTING SIGNALS AND TIMES (This changes RRS 26)

- 7.1 1350 – Warning/Preparatory signal for Division 1. An Orange banner will be displayed from the centre opening of the club veranda for five minutes.
- 7.2 1355 – Start signal for Division 1, Warning/Preparatory signal for Division 2. A Blue banner shall be displayed from the centre opening of the club veranda for five minutes.
- 7.3 1400 – Start signal for Division 2, Warning/Preparatory signal for Division 3. A Grey banner shall be displayed from the centre opening of the club veranda for five minutes.

- 7.4 1405 – Start signal for Division 3, Warning/Preparatory signal for Division 4. A Red banner shall be displayed from the centre opening of the club veranda for five minutes.
- 7.5 1410 – Start signal for Division 4, Warning/Preparatory signal for Division 5. A Green banner shall be displayed from the centre opening of the club veranda for five minutes.
- 7.6 1415 – Start signal for Division 5, the Green banner will be removed from the centre opening of the club veranda.
- 7.7 In Race 7 (the Centenary Regatta) the spinnaker divisions will start five minutes before the non-spinnaker divisions. The starting sequence for that race will be set out in the separate sailing instructions issued for the Centenary Regatta.

8. RACING AREA

Racing shall be conducted on Sydney Harbour.

9. COURSES

- 9.1 Courses are described in Appendix 1.
- 9.2 Courses will be signalled by a numeral board at the western end of the centre opening of the club veranda.

10. SHORTENED COURSES

- 10.1 Shortened Courses are described in Appendix 1.
- 10.2 The course for any Division may be shortened after rounding or passing mark WS or SM. The shortening of the course will be signalled by the display of coloured boards in the following locations:

DIVISION 1	ORANGE	Eastern end of the eastern veranda opening
DIVISION 2	BLUE	Centre of the eastern veranda opening
DIVISION 3	GREY	Western end of the eastern veranda opening
DIVISION 4	RED	Eastern end of the centre veranda opening
DIVISION 5	GREEN	Centre of the centre veranda opening

- 10.3 In the event all Divisions are shortened the five coloured boards will be displayed.
- 10.4 A flashing orange light on the club veranda may be used to draw attention to shorten course or abandonment. An announcement may be made on VHF Channel 73.

11. MARKS

Marks are described in Appendix 2.

12. OBSTRUCTIONS

- 12.1 Cardinal marks – boats shall not sail within the areas bounded by Cardinal Marks.
- 12.2 Moorings – except for naval moorings, boats shall not sail within mooring areas.
- 12.3 Shark Island – boats shall not sail between the AS Shark Mark (SM) and the Cardinal Mark south of Shark Island or between Shark Island and the Shark Island Light (north of Shark Island).

- 12.4 Garden Island and Chowder Bay – boats shall not sail within the yellow markers in the vicinity of Garden Island or near the naval wharf in Chowder Bay.

13. THE START

- 13.1 The starting line is between the Flag Mast of RPEYC and the western edge of the wharf on Shark Island crossing from East to West to start.
- 13.2 Boats intending to race should manoeuvre with sails up as close as possible to the moored boats in Felix Bay to register sail numbers with the Race Committee.

14. THE FINISH

- 14.1 The finishing line is between the flag mast of RPEYC and the western edge of the wharf on Shark Island crossing from West to East.
- 14.2 The finish of the leading boat in each division may be acknowledged by the waving of a flag from the club veranda opening.

15. RECALL

There will be no recall signal. Any boat over the line at the starting signal and not returning and starting correctly will have its finishing time increased by one minute or more at the discretion of the Race Committee. This changes RRS 29.

16. TIME LIMIT

The race time limit is 1700 hours.

17. PENALTY SYSTEM

Penalties shall be in accordance with RRS 44.1 and 44.2 only. RRS 44.3 shall not apply.

18. PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 18.1 Protests and Requests for Redress are to be lodged, in accordance with RRS 61, at the RPEYC Office or by email to secretary@rpeyc.com.au by 1000 hours on the first working day after the event.
- 18.2 Protests will be heard at the RPEYC club house on the following Wednesday unless otherwise decided by the Protest Committee. The hearing date and time will be advised to the parties involved, in accordance with RRS 63.2.

19. ARBITRATION

Arbitration may take place in accordance with RRS Appendix T.

20. SCORING

- 20.1 The scoring system in RRS Appendix A4 and RRS A5.3 will apply.
- 20.2 Pointscores are open to series entries only. Casual entries do not score points but are eligible for the weekly prize presentation.
- 20.3 Boats that have not started at least once in the first 8 races will be excluded from the series pointscore. This changes RRS A2.2.
- 20.4 A boat's series score will be the total of her race scores, excluding her worst scores in accordance with the following table. The number of races completed is the number of races in the series that are sailed and scored.

21. RETIREMENT

Yachts that retire from the race shall contact the Race Officer on VHF 73 or phone 0460 362 878 within the race time limit. Yachts failing to do so may be scored DNE. This changes RRS 63.1 and A5.

22. SKIPPERS BRIEFING

Each nominated helmsman of a boat entered shall have attended a safety briefing held by a yacht club located on Sydney Harbour for the current sailing season. Entries will not be accepted for any race or the series without a declaration by the person who signs or authorises the entry that every nominated helmsman has attended a safety briefing session.

23. SAFETY REGULATIONS

23.1 Boats shall comply with the following regarding commercial shipping.

- (a) Boats shall not pass between the bow of any Seagoing Ship and a dedicated Ports Authority escort vessel whilst on escort duty and within 500 metres from the bow and 30 metres from the side or stern of the Seagoing Ship.
- (b) Boats shall maintain a minimum distance of 200 metres from the bow, and 30 metres from the sides or stern of any ferry displaying the Orange Diamond.
- (c) Boats must abide by traffic directions of NSW RMS Boating Service Officers. Any yacht directed to stop or alter course by NSW RMS Boating Service Officers because of an anticipated breach of the above rules, incident/collision or complaint shall do so immediately.
- (d) Boats reported by NSW RMS as having contravened NSW RMS regulations shall be scored DNE without a hearing. This changes RRS 63.1 and A5.

23.2 Boats shall report any incident involving injury or Significant Damage likely to cost more than \$5,000 to the Race Committee at the first reasonable opportunity. Emergency services contact details are listed in Appendix 2.

23.3 Boats shall not carry anchors protruding beyond the bow while racing.

24. CHANGES AFFECTING PERFORMANCE

Any change to the hull, propeller, trim, spars or sails, or any significant change to onboard skill level, shall be notified in writing to RPEYC by email to secretary@rpeyc.com.au no later than 1500 hours on the day prior to the race affected by the change. This may result in a change of handicap.

25. INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be covered by current third-party property liability insurance and third-party personal liability insurance of not less than \$10,000,000 (ten million dollars) for each incident. All insurance cover shall be maintained during the period of racing.

26. PRIZES

- 26.1 Series prizes will be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each PHS division. Weekly prizes may be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each division at the discretion of RPEYC. Weekly prizes for IRC results may be awarded if sufficient entries are received.
- 26.2 Perpetual trophies will be awarded as listed in the Notice of Race.
- 26.3 Prize winners in the Centenary Regatta for the RPEYC Centenary Cup, the Windward Shield and the Classics Division will be determined using PHS, standardising each applicable boat's corrected time (elapsed time multiplied by the boat's TCF) to a standard course length, based on the course lengths published in Appendix 1 for the division sailed.
- 26.4 The series pointscore awards will be presented at the RPEYC Annual Prizegiving on Friday 14 May 2027.
